What is an Opioid Overdose?

Opioids are a variety of natural and synthetic compounds derived from the poppy seed. An overdose occurs when a person takes a large amount of opioids and has an adverse reaction.



What Causes Opioid Overdoses?

Opioids are a sedative. If a person takes too many opioids, their breathing can become too slow and shallow to sustain life.

Signs and Symptoms of an Opioid Overdose

If a person takes opioids and begins showing the following signs, they may be overdosing: choking sounds, vomiting, weak pulse, erratic breathing, bluish purple skin, or unconscious.
